



NJ Clean Cities Coalition Update

The NJ Clean Cities Coalition (NJCCC) is incorporated as a nonprofit corporation in the state of New Jersey for the promotion of the development, deployment and use of alternative fuels, alternative fuels vehicles, and the related infrastructure. As a designated Coalition within the U.S. Department of Energy's Clean Cities Program, the NJCCC is one of approximately 90 similar entities across the US, and the only one in New Jersey. Clean Cities strives to advance the nation's economic, environmental, and energy security by supporting local decisions to adopt practices that contribute to the reduction of petroleum consumption. The Clean Cities network of coalitions support the development of public/private partnerships to promote alternative fuels and advanced vehicles, fuel blends, fuel economy, hybrid vehicles, and idle reduction.

Two Stimulus grant applications submitted

Over the past two months, the NJCCC has been extremely busy with its members and other stakeholders in reviewing and assembling projects to respond to the unprecedented federal funding opportunities. Many worthwhile projects could not be included in these grant applications, but hopefully can be considered in future funding rounds. The projects that were submitted are believed to be strong candidates for the intense national competition, which is still pending at the time of this writing.

- DOE Clean Cities Grant submitted May 28, 2009

Requested funding in the amount of \$14.99 million to offset the incremental costs of deploying 277 natural gas vehicles (NGVs) for refuse and shuttle bus fleets operating in Newark, Camden, Trenton, Atlantic City and Egg Harbor Township, New Jersey. The project would annually provide an estimated reduction of 896,722.4 pounds of identified criteria pollutants and greenhouse gas emissions and 3,586,889.6 pounds of identified criteria pollutants and greenhouse gas emissions over a 4-year project life. The almost \$55 million total capital investment cost for this project includes 4 new CNG fueling stations which would be publicly available.

- EPA Diesel Emission Reduction program submitted April 28, 2009

Requested funding in the amount of almost \$7million for a project to install Diesel Particulate Filters on more than 300 heavy duty construction vehicles belonging to five different fleets throughout New Jersey. The active DPF technology provides up to 90% particulate matter reduction and reduces 70-80% Hydrocarbon and Carbon monoxide emissions.
